

Circular to Shareholders & Clerks: Online Credit Card Payments

We refer to correspondence sent out last month inviting members to register to gain access to their CCL accounts online. The online credit payment facility is also now available through the online portal. Shareholders and Clerks can use this facility as an alternate method to pay CCL invoices.
